Background

- Initiated by partners in IAWG training partnership
- Minimum Initial Service Package (MISP)
 - Objectives

SPRINT

Target: RH coordinators

- » Identify coordinators for the MISP
- » Plan for the provision of comprehensive RH services

Outreach Clinical Training Modules

Target: service providers

- » Prevent and manage the consequences of sexual violence
- » Reduce HIV transmission
- » Prevent excess neonatal and maternal morbidity and mortality

Objectives: managerial process (black) and outcomes (red)

In order to achieve the outcomes, a number of the outreach clinical training modules have been developed

Concept of the training modules

- To ensure good RH technical practices in MISP
- **Outreach** clinical training
 - 2-days/module x 5 modules
 - module could be taught separately
 - in-country training
- Working at PHC level
- Accredited doctors, nurses and midwives with experience in RH

Refresher course

Module	Status	Responsible agency
Standard precautions	Need to complete	<i>UNFPA</i>
Clinical management of rape	Ready	<i>UNHCR/ UNFPA</i>
Manual vacuum aspiration	Need to adapt	<i>IPAS</i>
Assisted vaginal delivery: vacuum extraction	Need piloting	<i>UNFPA</i>
Other signal functions (basic EmOC)	To be assigned	<i>Someone?</i>

Most modules are adapted from existing training materials

Other signal functions: parenteral oxytocics, antibiotics, anticonvulsant drugs, and manual removal of placenta

(+NB resuscitation??)

Example of module: Vacuum Extraction

- *Structure*
 - Lectures and simulated practice (with mannequin)
 - Group work on prolonged labour
 - Role playing
 - Evaluation of simulated practice
- *Need piloting*

- Completion of modules
- Piloting of some modules
- Standardization between modules
- Translation of modules
